Learning Intention

Students will be able to explore what it means to serve their school community, reflecting on the Global Compact of Education.

Success Criteria

Students will be able to identify what service means in the context of the school environment.

Students will be able to evaluate the difference between being individualistic and indifferent and loving and responsible.

Students will be able to analyse the different aspects of personal responsibility and the unique contribution young people can make to serve their school community.

Introduction

In May 2020 Pope Francis held a meeting with many leaders of different religions all over the world on the Global Compact on Education. Compact means agreement. It was particularly aimed at those involved in education and young people. At this meeting, Pope Francis called on young people to participate in this work: 'I also call upon you, young people, to take part in the meeting and to sense your real responsibility for the building of a better world.'
