Tuesday: Life to the Full in Our Faith Community



Introduction

'All it takes is one good person to restore hope.' (Pope Francis, Laudato Si', 71)

'Let us learn to live with kindness, to love everyone, even when they do not love us.' (Pope Francis, via Twitter/X)

'Each one of us is called to be an artisan of peace, by uniting and not dividing, by extinguishing hatred and not holding on to it, by opening paths to dialogue and not by constructing new walls!' (Pope Francis, Address to Participants in the International Meeting for Peace, 30 September 2013)

Suggested Activities

- Use Worksheet 1, included below (p. 5).
- Use Worksheet 2, included below (p. 6).
- Conduct a brief prayer service or prayer moment as included below (p. 4).
- Have the student place Post-It notes on a prayer board or classroom wall describing acts of kindness (putting ourselves in the shoes of others, thinking of one another this is essential to our being in a Christian community).
- Divide students into small groups. Have each group discuss a specific aspect of Christus Vivit, such as hope, community or personal vocation.
- Have the students make a poster with pictures, words or both on the theme 'Living fully in Christ means being of service in our faith community'. Add examples of how we serve others in our local Church or parish.
- Ask for music suggestions from students that express hope/joy. Play this music in the
 background while they are making posters individually or in groups. Before the class finishes,
 reflect on the tone/atmosphere of the class and if there seemed to be a good feeling in the group,
 highlight how it feeds into the well-being promoted through the theme for Catholic Schools
 Week.
- Think-Pair-Share: How can we engage more positively with the Church in our local community?
- Divide the students into small groups of three or four and ask them, 'How can we share joy, hope and courage with others?' List examples of how we experience this with friends.
- Have the students role-play situations when kindness is absent, for example on social media (Snapchat/TikTok), in the family, in school, playing sport, etc.
- Have the students role-play situations that show how kindness restores energy to our soul.

Concluding Reflection

Let me tell you a personal experience [...] I'm an absolute fan of chocolate, and my favourite bar is Galaxy Darker Milk. One day I brought some into work and put it on the counter in the staff room to make myself a cup of tea. Before I could do that, the secretary called me away to the phone.

When I came back, my Galaxy bar was gone. I immediately thought that one of my colleagues must have taken my chocolate bar, thinking it was for public consumption. I felt anger rising in myself and the urge to confront them about this perceived injustice.

Luckily, I decided to pause, acknowledged my puzzlement and anger, and reflected on whether blaming would be the best course of action. I took a deep breath and looked around.

Guess what happened? I saw that my precious Galaxy bar had fallen into the crack between the counter and the fridge. I was so glad I hadn't shouted and accused my colleagues, but gave my brain a chance to discern. This enabled me to act according to my values and not follow my first instincts.
